In the Works

Manakau School Safety Improvements

Work has begun to make Manakau School safer. We're improving car parking and installing a raised safety platform around the front entrance of Manakau School, as well as improving the footpaths outside the Manakau Bowling Club.

Works will be undertaken in three stages by our contractors, Higgins Contractors Levin, and are expected to be completed in mid-April.

Please be mindful of works being carried out and follow the temporary traffic management signs and cones each day while work is being completed, as these may be altered for traffic flow and safety as work progresses.

Cousins Avenue, Foxton Beach Drainage upgrades

Flooding has been an issue for Cousins Avenue West residents and we're keen to address this as soon as possible. Existing culverts are being replaced and the drains are being widened to allow a higher volume of water to be captured, to help alleviate water pooling on the surface of the berm. The new culverts will have an apron on either end to improve water capture and flow, allowing water to travel more effectively. The apron also provides a concrete surface that keeps weeds from growing around the inlet and outlet. Work is due to be completed by **Friday 24 March 2023**.

- Work is underway on the new drain progressing west along Foxton-Shannon Road, Foxton.
- A sleek new asphalt footpath has been laid around Levin's Winchester Store & Dairy.
- A new shared path is now open along Queen Street East, Levin.
- The redevelopment of Foxton Pools is going well. Last week our Councillors and members of Te Awahou Foxton Community Board visited the Foxton Pools site to check on the progress being made. Demolition is underway with more structural demolition to start soon.
- Hōkio Beach Road, Levin has been milled, paved and membrane sealed.



There is a new shared pathway in Shannon linking Graham Street to Vogel Street.



Panels and services are being installed at Waitārere Beach Surf Life Saving Community Facility.



The Donnelly Park netball courts have been resealed and the fence replacement is underway.



Green Flags

Horowhenua is only one behind Australia when it comes to Green Flag Awards.

The prestigious international accreditation rewards parks which provide high quality and innovative recreational experiences for communities, and with five in our district we only have one less Green Flag than the whole of Australia.

The award is maintained by a rigorous annual re-awarding application process, and all Horowhenua parks which have previously received a Green Flag were reawarded in 2023.

Important Notices

Temporary Road Closures

We're planning a number of road closures in the coming weeks.

Tararua Road, Levin

A section of Tararua Road, Levin between Garth Road and Arapaepae Road (SH57) is temporarily closed in both directions until approximately Friday 14 April 2023 (weather permitting) as a new wastewater main is being installed across the Tararua Road/SH57 intersection as part of the Tara-Ika future growth project. The entrance into Tararua Road heading west from SH57 will be closed. The only access to Tararua Road west of SH57 will be via Cambridge Street. Residents will be able to reach their properties via Meadowvale Drive or Queen

Kawiu Road, Levin

A carriageway on Kawiu Road, Levin is being reconstructed and the road improved. A section of Kawiu Road, Levin between Kawiu Marae and Lindsay Road will be closed from **Tuesday 28** March for approximately three weeks to complete the work. Residents will be given access as needed.

South Manakau Road

The bridge approaches and road on the one-lane bridge on South Manakau Road, Manakau, north of the Corbetts Road intersection are being improved. To do the work, a section of South Manakau Road, Manakau, between Mountain View Drive and Corbetts Road will be temporarily closed between 7am and 5pm on Tuesday 11 April to Friday 21 **April.** Residents will be given access as required.

As the work is weather dependent, the start and completion dates are subject to change. If needed, we will advertise alternative dates on horowhenua. govt.nz/PublicNotices.

Further work outside these dates will be undertaken under a Stop/Go system.

Water restrictions lifted

Thank you for your cooperation and efforts in helping to reduce water usage during the water restrictions. With the increased flow in the Ōhau River and reduction in water demand, water restrictions for Levin and Ōhau have been completely lifted, effective immediately.
