

# Notice of Motion - Foxton Main Street

## 1. Purpose

In accordance with Standing Order 3.10, to place the following Notice of Motion as a late item on the agenda for the Council meeting being held on 4 May 2016.

## 2. Executive Summary

Councillors Feyen and Campbell have proposed a Notice of Motion in relation to Foxton Main Street for consideration by Council (HDC).

## 3. Recommendation

- 3.1 That Report 16/234 on Notice of Motion - Foxton Main Street be received.
- 3.2 That this matter or decision be recognised as not significant in terms of s76 of the Local Government Act 2002.
- 3.3 That the Horowhenua District Council puts the redevelopment of Foxton Main Street on hold and establishes a working group of appropriate Foxton and Foxton Beach residents, in consultation with HDC, to develop a more streamlined and less expensive option, appropriate for Foxton.

## 4. Background

Council has been considering the upgrade of Foxton Main Street for a considerable number of years. With the development of Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom, design works and consultation have been undertaken to upgrade Main Street to accommodate the proposed demands that the new facility will create as well as augment the usage of the entire street.

Cr Feyen and Campbell are now requesting that the upgrade be placed on hold pending further consultation.



Supporting Information for Notices of Motion:

Motion 1

- Clearly there has not been an appropriate level of real consultation with residents of Foxton with the proposed changes to our wonderful wide Main Street. There is a clear majority grouping that do not want the proposed changes in their entirety.
- Petition. A petition objecting to the Main Street plans of HDC was instigated and conducted by two persons who took the time to speak with people and over a short period of time and had 193 persons sign it. (Petition attached).
- 'Straw Poll'. Councillor Campbell and I conducted a 90 minute 'straw poll' outside New World, Foxton and the results clearly showed that Foxton residents did not know or understand the extent of the HDC proposal for changes to the Main Street. (Photos attached)
- Standard of Public Consultation. This process has been very messy and hardly inclusive of the public of Foxton. The first major sign of this was the HDC displays at the old Westpac building in Main Street, Foxton. The information was in small print and did not include any quality visuals or even the entire project. You could not see the Cenotaph for example. I sent an email to CE Clapperton on 30 October, 2015 relating to this. (See attached). Also HDC promotional efforts at 2015 Spring Fling and the pop up council shop were using plans that have changed significantly since then. What new initiatives with the new plans for public consultation have been conducted since?
- Continuing Changes to Street Plan. Has anyone actually viewed a completed plan that can actually be seen? WHY were the public not allowed to ask any questions in public at the public meetings (two meetings were held) conducted by FCB and HDC? This is hardly consultation.
- Anecdotal. As a councillor who lives in Foxton full-time I (Michael Feyen), am constantly stopped in the street by people who do not like what is going to happen to the Main Street, or do not know what or why it is happening and do not agree with the cost of \$1.3-\$1.6 million for the work. Most want a simple high quality overdue 'hot' tar-sealing carried out on the street and many would like shop owners to have more pride in their shop frontages and refreshing and/or replacement of current murals.
- Facebook. Discussions have only just begun on this medium and are proving to be most insightful. So far no-one has wanted the current proposed changes. Most want a general sprucing up and would like to see money used on opening the Manawatu River Loop at Foxton first.
- For the Few-Not the many. Many people feel that the street is only being up-graded to appease a 'few' and not the general public. We agree with this ascertain.
- No consultation. Why would any town with such a wide Main street even contemplate one-waying a street such as Ravensworth Street? Of the 20 plus houses and one panel-beating business who will be affected, NONE have been consulted with in relation to the effects on them with a one-way system by HDC. Ravensworth Street is by far the preferred route option from Main Street towards the beach and Lady's Mile.
- Road closure process. Has there been a report conducted by the HDC CE Clapperton on whether the Horowhenua District Council has complied (or even sought) with their legal obligations under s342 of the Local Government Act 1974 before commencing work on Foxton's Main Street townscape project?
- Apparent safety of Road. Proof of accidents etc. Where is the documentation establishing that the Main Street needs road safety measures as proposed by HDC for safety reasons? Where are the accident statistics to warrant such major changes?

**Motion 2**

- Foxton is famous for its Main Street width.
- Foxton has competent people who are better suited to establishing what changes should occur in their own Main Street.
- As there is a budget of \$1.3-\$1.6 million for the project there are clearly enough monies for the level of change that most residents want.
- A 'project' team consisting of FCB members, mural society, artists, Main Street Business representative etc. will soon sort things out based on what people have said they want.

Hello David,

I have just visited Cathy McCartney at the old Westpac Bank building where there is a display regarding the proposed Main Street upgrade. As you are aware, I do not oppose an upgrade if that is what everyone wants and it is done properly, but I do not think that the displays are nowhere near adequate to give people a fair perception of what is being planned.

I spoke with Cathy about the fact that so many people stop me in the street who do not know what is planned. In that regard it is great to have public displays and a chance to speak with someone from council about the plans if they were clearer and to scale.

What is being presented does not show the following:-

- What is occurring with the one-waying of Ravensworth Place is not on the visual plan.
- most of what is occurring with the Cenotaph and the area around it is also not shown.
- there is no clear scale at all of the extent to which the footpaths will be widened and therefore the car parks protruding further into the Main Street.
- there is no clear gauge as to how much width will be taken from the actual Main Street
- it is clear that truck traffic to the super-market for deliveries will never be able to get from Main Street into Whyte Street and visa-versa. Both Cathy and I witnessed that first hand while we were chatting. This area will most definitely need to be looked at again as the islands planned obstruct pretty much anything bigger than a van. In fact a gentleman who was also present was in the middle of explaining this when the truck turned up. It is a very odd design on each corner at this intersection in my opinion. I also wonder about the ease of access and egress for the Fire engine and ambulance service.

I have suggested in the past at Council and FCB meetings that the Main Street gets painted outlines of what is happening so that people more understand the scale of the change. This occurred for the TANS project and was most helpful. I have never received any response as to why this cannot be done. It would only require the same sort of paint used at road accidents which disappears after a short while.

It has been amazing how often I have been stopped with many questions about the proposed changes but I simply cannot give a qualified answer as all of the documentation I have seen thus far (i.e. Major Project Updates, Council Circular in the Chronicle etc) have all been really small and virtually uninformative even for a person with good vision.

I think the presentation can be vastly improved and would be helpful to Cathy as well.

I have had numerous people say they have tried to find a Web or email address relating to this proposed project as well. Is there a clearer picture to be had with this type of media?

Is there a marketing plan relating to this project? For example why is it being done? The Main Street needs some change for sure but many are saying HDC could be most helpful with businesses who could do with a co-ordinated paint job to start with.

I understand that there is a communication plan. Could I please have a hard copy? Thanks.

It looks to me as well that the Horse Drawn Tram will probably be a thing of the past as I cannot see it being able to operate with the layout I have seen thus far. That would be a shame as this most definitely attracts many people to town on Sundays and Wednesdays as the horses are very popular with the children in particular.

I also think that the Spring Fling and any potential other large events will be a thing of the past with the current plans. That would be sad as all of the retail shops (if they are open) will miss out on big sales for those particular days.

Fundamentally I just want people to be more fairly informed as to what changes are taking place as most do not know and if over \$1 million plus is to be spent it has to be done right the first time around.

I remember the comments from a number of those present at the Foxton Future meetings who definitely saw the wideness of the Main Street as a major point of difference that they wished to keep. I recall some of them saying that this added to the uniqueness of Foxton. I personally agree with their sentiments given what I have seen thus far.

I understand that the display will be in place next week as well and I urge you to arrange a far clearer presentation pictorially and to scale. I am sure Boffer Miskall will be most helpful in this regard.

Thank you for your email regarding Foxton Main Street.

As you are aware we have been actively promoting the Foxton Main Street upgrade, using our usual channels and also utilising promotional opportunities the council does not always exploit as we are aware this is an significant change for the Foxton Community. Staff attended the Foxton Spring Fling and also set up a pop up council shop in the Westpac Building to promote these changes and have in-depth conversations with locals who had questions about the changes. Overall the conversations we have had to date were positive with many locals raising issue around real concerns but once they had the correct information they were happy with the proposed changes.

The project team have also been assisted by local businesses who have actively handed out the frequently asked questions and displayed posters in their facilities.

In relation to the issues that have been raised here are a few points to explain what has been completed so far, as you can appreciate we have a lot more promotional work and engagement to undertake.

- Boffa Miskell have supplied updated graphics which clearly illustrate the entire main street and cenotaph upgrade. These are attached.
- Attached is the is the communication plan for this project. From this you can see a number of actions have been completed and we still have further promotion and engagement to go.
- In the next two weeks we will be:
  - o Meeting with the Foxton Community Board and yourself to have a discussion with the councils infrastructure team.

- o Holding another community meeting to explain the upgrade with council staff on hand to answer any questions
- o Further communications explaining the need for the upgrade will go out in the media and in council communications.


**342 Stopping and closing of roads**

(1) The council may, in the manner provided in Schedule 10, —

- (a) stop any road or part thereof in the district;  
provided that the council shall not proceed to stop any road or part thereof in a rural area unless the prior consent of the Minister of Lands has been obtained; or
- (b) close any road to traffic or any specified type of traffic (including pedestrian traffic) on a temporary basis in accordance with that schedule and impose or permit the imposition of charges as provided for in that schedule.

*Stopping of roads*

- 1 The council shall prepare a plan of the road proposed to be stopped, together with an explanation as to why the road is to be stopped and the purpose or purposes to which the stopped road will be put, and a survey made and a plan prepared of any new road proposed to be made in lieu thereof, showing the lands through which it is proposed to pass, and the owners and occupiers of those lands so far as known, and shall lodge the plan in the office of the Chief Surveyor of the land district in which the road is situated. The plan shall separately show any area of esplanade reserve which will become vested in the council under section 215 (1).
- Schedule 10 Clause 1: amended, on 1 October 1991, by section 161 of the Resource Management Act 1991 (1991 No 67).
- 2 On receipt of the Chief Surveyor's notice of approval and plan number the council shall open the plan for public inspection at the office of the council, and the council shall at least twice, at intervals of not less than 7 days, give public notice of the proposals and of the place where the plan may be inspected, and shall in the notice call upon persons objecting to the proposals to lodge their objections in writing at the office of the council on or before a date to be specified in the notice, being not earlier than 40 days after the date of the first publication thereof. The council shall also forthwith after that first publication serve a notice in the same form on the occupiers of all land adjoining the road proposed to be stopped or any new road proposed to be made in lieu thereof, and, in the case of any such land of which the occupier is not also the owner, on the owner of the land also, so far as they can be ascertained.
  - 3 A notice of the proposed stoppage shall during the period between the first publication of the notice and the expiration of the last day for lodging objections as aforesaid be kept fixed in a conspicuous place at each end of the road proposed to be stopped:  
provided that the council shall not be deemed to have failed to comply with the provisions of this clause in any case where any such notice is removed without the authority of the council, but in any such case the council shall, as soon as conveniently may be after being informed of the unauthorised removal of the notice, cause a new notice complying with the provisions of this clause to be affixed in place of the notice so removed and to be kept so affixed for the period aforesaid.
  - 4 If no objections are received within the time limited as aforesaid, the council may by public notice declare that the road is stopped; and the road shall, subject to the council's compliance with clause 9, thereafter cease to be a road.
  - 5

If objections are received as aforesaid, the council shall, after the expiration of the period within which an objection must be lodged, unless it decides to allow the objections, send the objections together with the plans aforesaid, and a full description of the proposed alterations to the Environment Court.

- 10 The Chief Surveyor shall allocate a new description of the land comprising the stopped road, and shall forward to the District Land Registrar or the Registrar of Deeds, as the case may require, a copy of that description and a copy of the notice and the plans transmitted to him by the council, and the Registrar shall amend his records accordingly.

#### *Temporary prohibition of traffic*

- 11 The council may, subject to such conditions as it thinks fit (including the imposition of a reasonable bond), and after consultation with the Police and the New Zealand Transport Agency, close any road or part of a road to all traffic or any specified type of traffic (including pedestrian traffic)—

- (a) while the road, or any drain, water race, pipe, or apparatus under, upon, or over the road is being constructed or repaired; or
- (b) where, in order to resolve problems associated with traffic operations on a road network, experimental diversions of traffic are required; or
- (c) during a period when public disorder exists or is anticipated; or
- (d) when for any reason it is considered desirable that traffic should be temporarily diverted to other roads; or
- (e) for a period or periods not exceeding in the aggregate 31 days in any year for any exhibition, fair, show, market, concert, film-making, race or other sporting event, or public function;

provided that no road may be closed for any purpose specified in paragraph (e) if that closure would, in the opinion of the council, be likely to impede traffic unreasonably.

- 15 A copy of every resolution made under clause 13 shall, within 1 week after the making thereof, be sent to the Minister of Transport, who may at any time, by notice to the council, disallow the resolution, in whole or in part, and thereupon the resolution, to the extent that it has been disallowed, shall be deemed to have been revoked.
- 16 No person shall—
- (a) use a vehicle, or permit a vehicle to be used, on any road which is for the time being closed for such vehicles pursuant to clause 11; or
- (aa) without the consent of the council or the promoter of any activity permitted by the council, enter or attempt to enter, or be present, on any road or part of a road that is for the time being closed to pedestrian traffic pursuant to clause 11; or

# Foxton Main St upgrade opposed

Local plans for Foxton's Main St upgrade are not getting some support, says developer Karoline Tucker.

Several people commented on the Horowhenua Mail following a statement by Foxton Community Board chair Gordon Street that the making of a Main St upgrade is currently "pending" and being supportive of the plans presented.


Horowhenua District Council Mayor and Foxton resident Nicholas Poyser said "initially no one wants" the current plans.

"I get annoyed every time I get my nose out of my front door with people haranguing me about their opposition" to the proposed changes.

While he would be open to some changes, there had been "no real consultation" he claimed. Foxton Mayor, Richard Christopher Patten said she had talked to many people about the issue, and all were against the plans to narrow the road.

She said one of several who supported many present at the March 30 meeting had been these questions were addressed, and a sewer system had had been set up so people at the back could have a sewer system. "It was a case of get up and pay the bill, it was a total bust." Patten said.

Street said that consulting a sewer system was available for the meeting had been an "error". However she believed there was a strong rationale from the community for the changes, and it was only a vocal few who were unhappy. The upgrade had been
