Subject: Ford Ranger NZ Rural Games 2021, 12 – 14 March, Palmerston North Square.

### What the Games are all about

- Largest rural sporting event in middle NZ. Now into our seventh year of hosting these Games that built our nation; free to the public, yet cost just under \$1 million to run, this is due to the incredible generosity of our major sponsors and many minor ones, plus local government and other sources of community funding.
- 2. Iconic fit for the central region as they contribute to the social and mental well-being of our rural and urban communities.
- 3. Celebration of our rural sports men and women; international and national champions competing in an idyllic Square in the heart of Palmerston North; accessible to all ages, plus attendance of 400 at an awards dinner celebrating outstanding performances by rural sports athletes and administrators on the preceding Friday evening.
- 4. 'Have a Go' events enable everyone from preschoolers to elderly to take part in events that prioritise keeping active and enhancing our wellness. This also exposes the competitors up close to the businesses and industries of the Agri-sector.
- 5. On the Friday afternoon 60 teams of secondary students from 32 school engage in a "Clash of the Colleges" competition.
- 6. The Agri- Futures Expo for Yr 12 & 13 secondary students takes place on the Friday morning to which all 32 secondary schools across our Horizons region are invited. All the rural organisations will showcase their sector plus pathways to jobs in the agri-sector, on farm and off- farm, manufacturing and food processing, innovation, agritech etc.
- 7. Over six large screens live stream the Games across the Square so that elderly and those with disabilities can sit in comfort and watch what is going on, commentated by our three top sports commentators.
- 8. Extensive media coverage on TV One, TV Three, The Project, Seven Sharp, plus a one hour documentary highlighting the Games and viewed internationally. We also received coverage on Country Calendar which rated so well a further six programmes on Rural Games athletes will be created in the coming year.
