Kennedy to Cambridge Wastewater Upgrade


Tatana Contractors, Levin are renewing and upgrading the existing wastewater main from Kennedy Drive/Glen Street intersection through to Highbury Drive/Cambridge Street intersection to ensure a more reliable wastewater network.

The construction work is set to start on 21 August 2023 and is expected to be completed by 19 October 2023, weather dependant Motorists are advised that Stop-Go signs will operate until the project is completed. Working hours will be from 7am to 6pm each weekday.

Access to entrances and exits on Glen Street and from lot number 2 to 16 on Highbury Drive may be restricted – affected residents will be advised beforehand

Kings Drive Wastewater Reticulation Renewal Update

Higgins Contractors, Levin are renewing and upgrading the existing wastewater main on Kings Drive, Levin to ensure a more reliable wastewater network.

Footpath upgrades started on 1 August 2023. Work began on the North-West side footpath. Some driveway crossings along Kings Drive will be restricted to allow for the necessary footpath and driveway crossings repairs.

This scope of work will continue to the East through the end of the month. Because concrete takes at least two days to cure, the driveways may be out of service during this period.

We are sorry for any inconvenience this may cause, and we encourage you to take note of and follow the temporary traffic management each day, as there is still ongoing work for the new sewer main.


