

Message from the Mayor

Kia ora Horowhenua,

It's been a busy fortnight since the last Community Connection and alongside productive workshops and meetings, I've also enjoyed time engaging with people across our district at various events.

It was wonderful to see people coming together to celebrate Waitangi Day to acknowledge and commemorate the signing of Te Tiriti o Waitangi at a number of community events. I enjoyed visiting the Muaūpoko Iwi and Community Waitangi Day event at Donnelly Park, Levin, where, like other events in Foxton and Shannon, large numbers of people from our diverse community came together to enjoy the sunshine and fun activities.

The Medieval Market was held last weekend which saw a record number of stallholders, and visitors enjoying this hugely successful event. There was also events to mark the commencement of the Chinese New Year on Saturday at Te Takeretanga o Kura-hau-pō and Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom which featured Tai Chi and Kung Fu demonstrations, traditional Chinese, dragon and lion dancing and Chinese cuisine. I'm looking forward to opening and judging at the Shannon Spectacular Car & Bike Show on Sunday 18 February which is predicted to be a popular event as well.

Outside of these larger events, it was wonderful to talk with people at Shannon Library during our February Cuppa with a Councillor. These monthly

events are held every second Thursday of the month between 10.30am and 12.30pm at Te Takeretanga o Kura-hau-pō, Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom and Shannon Library, giving you an opportunity to chat with one of your elected members face to face about things that are important to you.

The kōrero through these sessions has been extremely valuable, and we appreciate hearing your thoughts on how we can help Horowhenua grow and thrive, and how to tackle the big challenges in front of us.

These conversations are particularly appreciated as we prepare our Long Term Plan (LTP). Consultation will be open between Friday 15 March and Monday 15 April, giving you an opportunity to get involved and share your feedback. Council has been busy with a number of workshops and briefings exploring the challenging topics of which services we need and ultimately how we keep rates increases and service cuts to a minimum, how we should be funding kerbside recycling and how we share the costs.

As part of Horowhenua District Council's Levin Town Centre Transformation Strategy, we will soon be seeking expressions of interest (EOIs) from property developers to reimagine the Levin War Memorial Hall.

With no pre-conceived ideas on how the Levin War Memorial Hall could be used, as long as it has a positive influence on the town centre, there is the possibility to incorporate the adjacent Village Green and Skate Park sites if desired by property developers. Council will consider proposals that are provided through the EOI process.

Community members are invited to share their support or objections about the sale of the Levin War Memorial Hall, potentially developing the Village Green site, and moving the Skate Park to a new location (which will be determined at a later date if needed) by contacting us by Thursday 29 February 2024.

Important Notices

Withdrawal of Proposed Plan Change 5 for Waitārere Beach Growth Area

As of Wednesday 13 December 2023, the Proposed Plan Change 5 (Waitārere Beach Growth Area) has been officially withdrawn.

This decision comes after the Plan was placed on hold for an extended period, largely due to the challenges associated with managing stormwater and wastewater.

This notice is issued in accordance with Clause 8(d) of the First Schedule of the Resource Management Act 1991.

Water Conservation and Restrictions

Council draws water from rivers and groundwater under resource consents. The conditions of these consents and the demand for water set the trigger levels for Council to issue water restrictions.

To ensure water demand does not exceed the available supply, restrictions may be put in place.

- 1 Levin and Ōhau are in Water Conservation Level 1 until further notice.
- 3 Level 3 Water Restrictions are in place for Foxton and Foxton Beach further notice.
