Sealed Road Resurfacing

We're underway with our annual road resealing programme. Mangahao Road and Foxton Beach Road are among those which have been completed — each receiving their second seal following last year's rehabilitation work. Over the next two months our contractors will continue resealing roads across the district that have been identified as needing resurfacing. Residents will be notified by letter drop before their street is resealed, and you can see the list of roads due for a spruce-up on our website.

Reinstating Donnelly Park

Now we've moved on to the second stage of replacing the main inlet pipe for the Levin wastewater treatment plant on Mako Mako Road we've also been able to start reinstating Donnelly Park. Parts of the park were closed while the first stage of the pipe was laid. Depending on grass growth we hope it will be open again by the holiday season. Thanks everyone for your patience.

The second stage of pipe renewal runs from the corner of Adkin Avenue and Collingwood Street through to Tiro Tiro Road north of Trafalgar Street. We're engaging with residents, schools and businesses to keep them informed of road or lane closures as we carry out this essential upgrade.





Are you eligible for a rates rebate?

The second Horowhenua District Council rates instalment of the 2025/26 financial year is due to be paid by 15 December, and Council is encouraging ratepayers to check whether they are eligible for a rebate.

You should have received your invoice in your letterbox or inbox by now.

The Rates Rebates Scheme provides a rebate of up to \$805 for low-income earners who are paying rates for the home they were living in on 1 July 2025. Rebates will be calculated based on income, the number of dependents living with you, and the total amount of rates you'll pay from 1 July 2025 to 30 June 2026, including Horowhenua District Council and Horizons Regional Council.

Eligible households can have income up to \$32,210 and get the maximum rebate. Households getting more than this may still get a rebate, but it will be less than the full amount. SuperGold cardholders and their households can have income up to \$45,000 and get the maximum rebate amount.

To apply, you'll need proof of income (before tax) for the tax year ended 31 March 2025 (this includes any interest at the bank), proof of your spouse/ partner's or joint income if living together, and your SuperGold card, if applicable.

If you want your rebate applied to the second rates instalment, you must apply by 5 December 2025. Applications received after this date will have the rebate applied to instalment 3.

Proposed Temporary Road Closures - Horowhenua Christmas Parade

Horowhenua District Council proposes that several Levin streets be closed on Saturday 6 December 2025 for the annual Horowhenua Christmas Parade.

The parade will begin at the corner of Victoria Street and Weraroa Road, turning right onto Bath Street before finishing on Salisbury Street outside the Levin Domain.

We propose that the following roads be temporarily closed to all ordinary vehicular traffic to enable the parade to travel the planned route:

Victoria Street will be closed from 11am to 2.30pm to allow floats to gather before the parade begins. While resident access along Victoria Street will be allowed, we ask that no cars be parked on the street during this road closure period.

Salisbury Street will be closed between 1pm and 6.30pm for the Christmas Carnival at the Levin Domain.

Weraroa Road between Victoria Street and **Bath Street** will be closed from 1.45pm to 2.30pm.

No resident access will be available during the period of these proposed closures.

These closures are proposed under clause 11(e) of the Tenth Schedule of the Local Government Act 1974. The proposed closures will apply to all vehicular traffic with the exception of emergency service vehicles and vehicles directly involved with the events.

No more cash at transfer stations

From 15 December cash will no longer be accepted at the council-run waste transfer stations at Foxton and Shannon.

Currently fewer than ten percent of transactions at the Foxton transfer station are cash.
